Jewish holidays begin at sundown on the evening before the first day.

Days highlighted in yellow are "festival" or "holy" days during which many Jews refrain from all types of work, (and many do not write, travel, or use electronics on such days).

Not all Jews observe these festival days in the same way, and some individuals may be more strict in their observance of one holiday, and less strict for another.

Attending class or taking exams on **any** of the festival/holy days may present a problem for Jewish students, but **the most widely observed days** include:

Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, and the first days of Passover.
